## Neighbors in Need

The Neighbors in Need offering on Oct. 2 supports justice and compassion ministries throughout the United States. Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC to fund local and national justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. Some of these funds are distributed through grants to local churches. If you have a grant idea for Bismarck UCC, let a member of Council know!

One-third of the offering supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Historically, forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hockak in North and South Dakota, Wisconsin, and northern Nebraska. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM.

Getting to worship together is always a celebration and an important way to feed our souls! This month, we are pleased to share that Elicia Faul, who we connected with through our ecumenical Taize Worship services is releasing an album of her own spirit-filled music. Mark your calendars for our next Taize Worship service on November 2 at St. George's Church.

"Dig Deep." It's something Bismarck singer/songwriter Elicia Faul knows well. It's also the title of her recently released pandemic album. "I started posting a series of videos on Facebook (LooseLeaves) that captured my songwriting process." Those postings evolved into a worthy and evocative collection of heartfelt tunes. From her delightful, "Simple, Sacred Song," that appreciates the gifts of love even at the end of a relationship to "Beautiful" that looks at changing realities that are ultimately seen when grounded in feelings, Faul's lyrics and melodies have a certain North Dakota sensitivity that appeals.

When not creating, Faul, who started singing at age three, is an acupuncturist and single mother. "Coming back to music in my 40s with three kids is not the typical model. It forces me to face my own fears about what others think and not being good enough. Thinking of my daughters I wanted to show that vulnerability for them. If you have something you're passionate about, you should Dig Deep and try. Don't hold yourself back for any reason."
