# Do You Know Your Roots?

When I think of my roots, the first things that come to mind are my German and Romanian heritage that gave me my physical characteristics and family traditions; my family, friends, and mentors who taught me about life and helped to hone my gifts and reshape my shortcomings; the land I have lived on and the cycles of the seasons; and the faith communities I have been transformed by. When you think of your roots what, where, or who comes to mind?

Our roots shape who we are, but we also continue to shape our roots throughout our lifetimes. The choices we make, the places we choose to live, and the communities we commit ourselves to eventually turn into our roots. Eight years ago, I committed myself to serve and be a part of Bismarck United Church of Christ. In fact, I moved halfway across the country because of who this church is. I chose to be rooted in and changed by this particular faith community because of your love for one another, your humor and laughter, your willingness to look at the world anew, your hunger for spiritual depth, your compassion for the wider-community, and so much more.

I also came because I felt I had things from some of my other roots to offer to you too. As your pastor, serving this congregation is my work, but Bismarck UCC is also the faith community that I, like so many of you, choose to be shaped by. And, like you, each year I get a pledge card and reconsider what I can add to God's work of transforming people's lives and the wider-community through Bismarck UCC. Each year, I recommit myself to the ministries of this church through my own pledge to Bismarck UCC and to OCWM (Our Congregation's Wider Mission). OCWM is the second line on the annual pledge card and donations to it magnify the work of our single congregation by supporting ministries of the entire UCC across the United States.

Some people pledge to meet the budget. I see the budget and am immensely grateful to all of you who help us meet the budget, because running programs, caring for the building, holding worship, and organizing community events all take money. But I don't pledge because of the budget. I pledge because Bismarck UCC is now a part of my roots and I have seen the impact this church has had on the wider community. Bismarck needs the love, compassion, and courage this congregation has to offer. That's why I look forward to dedicating my pledge in worship on November 14 alongside your own.

**Weekly Shining of Light** – Choose an activity for each week that allows you to share God's light with others. The following are examples to get you started:


- Shovel the neighbor's sidewalks
